






MADD Night

Student emails - Important change!

From Day 1 Term 4, students will no longer be able to use their school email address to sign in to social media, gaming, instant messaging, dating and similar platforms. This also means that students won't be able to use password-recovery emails from these platforms.


Any students who currently use their school email (@education.nsw.gov.au) to sign in to apps or websites like Facebook, Instagram, TikTok, Snapchat, Discord, Steam, Twitch, PokemonGo etc need to take action now:

- 1. Log into the site or app with their school email address
- 2. Use settings to update their email address to a personal account, eg: @gmail.com
- 3. Confirm or Verify their personal email.

These steps will need to be taken before the start of Term 4 on 14 October.

Each app or site will have a 'help' section with more specific information on how to change email details.

For some students, they may need to create their own personal email account. Parents and carers are reminded that many sites, including email, have minimum age restrictions. The e-Safety Commissioner has a great deal of useful information on how parents can help their child to make good choices and stay safe online.



Year 11 - Interview

Every Year 11 student has now completed an 'aspirations interview' with Ms Walsh and Mr Wall. Students were asked to attend the interview, having reflected on current short term study goals and longer-term vocational goals.

Paramedicine, midwifery, combat engineer, environmental scientist, policing, naval communications officer, diesel mechanic, gaming design and journalism are just some of the vocational ambitions.

We also discussed current performance, based on assessment marks and self-evaluation of effort and focus. There were many honest and worthwhile conversations about how HSC year can be one of personal progress and success. Each student has set subject goals and identified the strategies that they need to employ to reach the goals.

Students are always welcome to discuss further goals, change in directions or seek support to remain focused and motivated.



Numeracy in Primary School


Sports provide a good opportunity to engage your child in maths, particularly if they are a keen sportsperson. Here are some questions to ask your child when watching or playing their favourite sport:

- · How does your favourite sport tally the score? What maths is presented on the tally?
- · How do other sports tally the score for example, tennis, golf, cricket, netball, football?
- What maths could you use to find the total of the scores?
- Who is at the top of the ladder? How is this determined?
- How long do your favourite sport games go for in minutes and seconds? How is the time in the game divided? Into halves, quarters or something else?
- · What are the shapes of different playing fields and courts? Talk about edges and angles.
- · How can you estimate the perimeter and area of a playing field


Game Spotlight - Strike it Out!

Instructions -


- · Start by drawing a number line from zero to 20.
- The first player chooses two numbers from the number line and crosses them out.
- The same player then circles the sum or difference of the numbers and records the calculation.




For example:



- The second player must start their turn by crossing out the number circled by the first player.

RUOK Day at BCS

Last Thursday, BCS was awash with bright splashes of yellow as students and staff participated in RUOK Day, a national initiative focused on suicide prevention and mental health awareness. This day has become increasingly significant, especially for younger people, as it encourages open conversations around mental health and emotional well-being.

Stage 5 students engaged in thoughtful discussions about what it means to be a "Good Mate," focusing on the qualities and actions that show genuine support when asking someone, "Are you OK?" Year 10 Term 4 Work Experience

This week, Year 10 students will be receiving forms for their upcoming two-week work experience block in Term 4. Students will now have ample time to organise a placement in a field of interest, giving them a valuable opportunity to gain hands-on experience in a real-world work environment. Work experience is a fantastic way for students to explore different industries and career options before they commit to specific study pathways or enter the workforce. It helps them build practical skills, develop a deeper understanding of workplace expectations, and make more informed decisions about their future education and career goals. We encourage students to take full advantage of this opportunity and start thinking about potential placements that align with their interests. Parents and guardians are encouraged to discuss options with their children and support them in organising meaningful placements.

Attendance

As per the Department of Education Policy: Student attendance in NSW public schools' procedures:

Parents and carers:

- must ensure their children of <u>compulsory school age</u> are enrolled in a public or registered non-government school or, they are registered with the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) for home schooling
- must ensure their children who are enrolled at school attend every day the school is open for instruction
- work in partnership with the school to plan and implement strategies to support regular attendance, including communicating with the school if they are aware of issues impacting on their child's attendance or engagement with school
- must provide an explanation for absences to the school within 7 days of each individual absence.

Parents and carers are reminded that absences must be notified and explained to the school.

- School staff must contact the parent or carer of any student absent without an explanation on the day of the absence. At BCS we contact our parents / carers via automatic generated electronic with an SMS
- We are required to continue to attempt to contact the parent or carer until either an explanation is received or the student returns to school.

At Braidwood central we will be implementing the following process for Term 4

If a student is absent for 5 consecutive days or 5 days in a fortnight

- Front office staff will send an email requesting a medical certificate
- The student is referred to the Attendance Team to commence intervention planning, which could include:
- Parent / carer interview
- · Creation of an attendance plan
- · Referral to the Home School Liaison program

We will also be acknowledging excellent and improving attendance on a fortnightly basis with communication home and end -of-year recognition.
