

The information from NAPLAN results is triangulated with check-in assessments and in-school data to inform key actions for our Strategic Directions.

Our parent teacher interview evening was held last Tuesday evening. It was great see so many parents to discuss the start of the year and where to next with their child. If you were unable to attend that evening you are always able to contact your child's class teacher and arrange a meeting time. Three way conversations including your child, yourself and the class teacher will be held later in the year.

K-6 Numeracy

Hints and tips for helping with mathematics homework at home.

As parents and carers, it can sometimes be frustrating trying to support your child with their homework. Here are some ways that you can assist your child:

- · encourage your child to try, then keep trying
- encourage your child to think out loud when they are working through a problem
- · try getting them to draw their thinking or use concrete materials
- try getting your child to check their answers by asking 'Does this answer make sense?'

If your child is getting frustrated, you can help by asking questions and giving instructions like:

- · "What do you already know about this problem/question?"
- · "How might you work it out?"
- "Explain why you think that is the answer?"
- "What could the wrong answer be and why isn't it correct?"

Remember, it is important to not focus on the correct response only, the process of doing mathematics is important. Allowing your child to experience a 'sweaty brain' is an essential aspect of the learning process.







Uniform reminder

Braidwood Central School supports the wearing of a school uniform. This promotes a sense of belonging for students and creates a positive identity for the school community. School uniforms also contribute to the personal safety of students by allowing easier recognition of students inside the school and in the community.

Students are expected to wear the uniform during school hours, while travelling to and from school, and when engaged in school activities outside of school hours.
